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Dear Friends of FRNV,



[An extract from Poojya Swamiji's message to the participants of the Value Education Workshop held on 22nd Aug in New Delhi.]



"Value" is a word too dear, potent and pregnant. Value

is more a concept first, a pursuit next and an adherence and dedication thereafter. Any value becomes so, only when it is able to enrich, empower and elevate human life at any level, making the individual, family, society and Nation grow with mutuality, cohesion and invincible collective strength.

Schools, Colleges or other educational centres will be able to fulfil their role only when the Institution is wedded to the fundamental values of teaching and learning.

Value, to be so, has to be the common means to integrate, preserve and empower

the human mind and intelligence, imbuing strength, charm, efficiency and esteem to them.

The alternative to Value is utter chaos and disorder, which are rampant the world over. If this adversity is allowed to creep in, what is sure to result is decline, degeneration, disaster. This makes value not an option, but a compulsion.

At no time should any doubt or unwillingness about value inculcation be entertained. For value is the one unquestionable bequest any generation can bequeath to the next.

Values at any time begin with the individual, enfold the family and extend to the society, nation and globe. Any value, to be inspiring and forceful, must instill emotional persuasion and evoke rational compulsion. For this, the value has to be related to the mind and intelligence. None can then resent or refuse its need or impact.

Values are ever two-fold, eternal and contemporary. Contemporary may change to adapt to the changing times. But eternal, like the mind and soul in us, will not and cannot. Our greater emphasis should be on the eternal value enrichment. This is where the right consensus and compulsion can and should evolve, if rightly dealt with.

NATIONAL VALUE EDUCATION

Workshop to Co-create Standards of Integrity for the Educational ecosystem

A workshop was held on 22nd August 2009 in New Delhi to jointly co-create standards for

Values for inculcation in the School Education System.

Close to 40 individuals, including parents, principals, teachers, students, school Management, policy makers, participated in the half-day event.

In 6 groups, the participants deliberated upon values each of the different stakeholders need to 'imbibe and live' towards creating a value-based society.

The next step would be compile the findings of the workshop to create Value Standards for the whole Nation's Education System should adopt. It is proposed that these Standards would be formally launched in the month of November this year.

The workshop focused on the following key questions:

What are the values I should be living in order to create a value-based society? What are the enablers and obstacles to value inculcation? What are my expectations from the other stakeholders in the education ecosystem? What are my commitments to the other stakeholders in the education ecosystem?
